

GPMC Phlebotomists are important members of any clinical laboratory team. The job of a Phlebotomist is to obtain blood and various other clinical specimens from the patients. New diagnostic techniques, clinical laboratory technology, and automated instruments have greatly increased the demand for trained Phlebotomist. Phlebotomist can work in hospitals, blood banks, physician offices or in independent labs.
